

Its about taking very difficult decisions










Water security is the capacity of societies to achieve a successful and comprehensive management of their resources and water services to meet the needs of each of the dimensions covered by water security:

> 5. Resilience To Water Related Natural Disasters

Build resilient and adaptable communities to climate change and minimize the impacts of future disasters.

4. Urban

Develop healthy, vibrant, livable, water-sensitive cities and towns.

The five dimensions of water security Preserving Ecosystems Integrity

1. Environmental

Restore the health of ecosystems, aquifers and rivers at the national, regional and global scale.



2. Domestic

Satisfy household water and sanitation needs in rural and urban communities.

3. Economic

Use water to promote economic growth from the production of food, industrial products and energy.
















Nature Base Solutions: Growing evidence, but still not mainstream in the water sector























Financial structure of water funds
